# Guiding questions for analyzing student data

#### Main questions

- 1. What patterns do the data reveal?
- 2. What might data reveal about students' needs?
- 3. What adaptations may be needed to make the intervention more effective?

## Progress monitoring

- 1. Are we collecting data often enough?
- 2. Is the progress monitoring tool sensitive to change?
- 3. Does the measure align to the content of the intervention?
- 4. Am I collecting data at the right level?

### Intervention fidelity

- 1. Did the student receive the right dosage of the intervention?
- 2. Did the student receive all components of the intervention as planned?
- 3. Did other factors prevent the student from receiving the intervention as planned (absences, behavior issues, scheduling changes, group size, staff training)?

#### Intervention match

- 1. Is the intervention an appropriate match given the students' skill deficits or target behavior?
- 2. Is the intensity of the intervention appropriate, given the student's level of need, or are adaptations or intensifications needed?
- 3. Are academic and behavioral issues interrelated?
