STAFF



A collaborative team approach is used throughout the program. The staff consist of:

- ☆ Certified Special Education Teachers
- ☆ Licensed Teaching Assistants
 - ☆ Speech-Language Pathologist
 - ★ Occupational Therapist
 - ★ Physical Therapist
 - * Adaptive Physical Education Teacher
 - ★ Licensed Nursing Staff
 - ☆ On-site Leadership, Office, and Building Personnel

Classroom staff are trained in personal cares, including g-tube feeding/pumps, medication administration, respiratory care (suctioning), toileting/incontinence care, seizure care, and positioning/skin integrity. Staff also receive training in Crisis Prevention (CPI).



STUDENTS



Fairview South programming is designed to meet the unique needs of secondary age students with significant intellectual disabilities, students who are medically fragile and students with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Students may also need support in the areas of nursing, personal cares, communication, behavior, vision, hearing, physical and motor skills. Students from Southeast Wisconsin counties including Waukesha, Milwaukee, Racine, Washington, Jefferson and Ozaukee have been educated at Fairview South School since 1971.
