

Message from Principal Schroeder

Hello Wisconsin Hills Families,



My name is Matt Schroeder, principal at Wisconsin Hills Middle School. For the past four years, I have been an associate principal at Brookfield Central HS, and prior to that I was a Teaching & Learning Specialist, English Teacher, Spanish teacher, AVID Elective teacher, and Reading Interventionist at Brookfield East HS. I started in Elmbrook in 1998 teaching Spanish at Pilgrim Park Middle School. Now, I am more than excited to begin this journey with all of you at Hills.

It has been a busy summer preparing for the 2019-2020 school year. Our biggest project from a facilities standpoint has been in the Library. We have increased the visibility to our MakerSpace (Fab Lab) by removing the wall and installing glass doors, enhancing accessibility and indirectly reinforcing the design thinking process. We have also added several comfortable spaces for students to work both individually or in teams. Tuesday, September 3, 2019 This will be a full day of school for ALL Students from 7:18 a.m. to 2:31 p.m.


6th Graders will receive special treatment upon arrival. As they come off their bus, the 7th grade

Morning Arrival:

School buses drop off students at the North end of the building. Students may enter through either set of doors and report directly to the cafeteria or Library if it is before **7:00 am**. Parents should plan to drop off students along the curb next to our cafeteria. Parents are asked to pull down the sidewalk as far as possible before stopping to drop off their students. **Please do not drop students off in the driveway without pulling to the curb.** It is unsafe to have students cross between other cars pulled against the curb who may not see your son/daughter crossing in front/back of them. Please allow additional time for drop-off on days when it is raining or snowing.



Afternoon Dismissal:

Buses depart WHMS at approximately 2:40pm. Our WHMS traffic patterns, signage, and safety expectations have been established in collaboration with the Brookfield Police Department.

FOR SAFETY & SECURITY, we ask parents who pick up their child to wait in their cars. Students being picked up will not be permitted to enter the parking lot until all buses have departed. To reduce traffic and wait times, we strongly encourage students to ride the bus whenever possible.


Riding the Bus Home With A Friend:

Permission to ride a bus other than one's own must be gained by presenting a signed note from to the school office.**Signed notes must be brought to the school office as soon as the student arrives to school in the morning**. A bus pass will be issued to the student as long as space permits on the bus. Students must give this approved bus pass to the driver. Drivers will not accept non-route students on their bus without an approved bus pass. **Each student is allowed to bring a maximum of two other students onto their bus space permitting**. *Email: KosankeM@elmbrookschools.org*



BE SAFE Check out the next page for our traffic flow.






Traffic patterns have changed at WHMS over the past few years. Please pay attention to the traffic flow patterns outlined on the map.
