THIS MONTH'S TOPIC: CODING



Goding Treasure Hunt

- 1. One person hides a "treasure" in an indoor or outdoor space.
- 2. Next, that person writes out instructions explaining how to find the hidden object. The instructions need to be very clear so the seeker knows exactly what to do in order to find the treasure.

Example:_

1) Take 10 steps STRAIGHT

Turn RIGHT and take 5 big hops

3) Turn LEFT and crawl 8 times

4) Dig 2 inches down to find the treasure!

Once the instructions are written, the seeker follows them exactly. If instructions aren't clear enough, the hider may need to find the bug and fix it so the seeker can successfully locate the treasure.
