



Comparison of Early College Credit Program & Start College Now

Overview

The 2017 Wisconsin Act 59 eliminated the Course Options and Youth Options programs as of 6/30/18.

Beginning 7/1/18:

- The Youth Options statute (118.55) was renamed the **Early College Credit Program**, which allows Wisconsin public and private high school students to take one or more courses at an institution of higher education for high school and/or college credit. Under this section, “institution of higher education” means an institution within the University of Wisconsin System, a tribally controlled college, or a private, nonprofit institution of higher education located in the state. - **Start College Now** (38.12(14)) allows WI public school pupils that have completed 10th grade to have the option to take courses at technical colleges through a separate statute Start College Now, 38.12(14). Application and Notification	<p>Students must submit an application to the IHE in the previous school semester. The student must notify the school board or the governing body of the private school of the student’s intent to enroll in an IHE.</p> <p>Wis. Stat. § 118.55(2)(a)</p>	<p>Student must submit a Start College Now application that notifies the school district (“board”) within the identified deadlines to request enrollment at the technical college at which course(s) are being sought.</p> <p>Wis. Deadline for notification or application	<p>Students must notify district of intent to enroll in Early College Credit Program courses by March 1st (for fall courses) and October 1st (for spring courses). <p>District denial of high school credit for ECCP or Start College Now course</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Doesn't satisfy a high school graduation requirement · District offers comparable course <p>Note: see <i>payment section, district is still responsible for 25% of the cost in the event the course is taken for postsecondary credit only</i></p> <p>Wis.Stat. § 118.55(3)(b)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Doesn't satisfy a high school graduation requirement · District offers comparable course · Student applicant has record of disciplinary challenges. <p>Note: <i>Student may still take the requested course if student meets enrollment and course pre-requisites as a regular WTCS student, outside of Start College Now. If so, student will have to pay all costs and, if determined to not satisfy a high school graduation</i></p>

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	<p>The tuition charged for each credit assigned to the course may not exceed the following:</p> <p>For an institution within the UW System or a tribally controlled college (other than UW college campus), cost is 1/3 of the amount that would be charged for each credit assigned to the course to an individual who is a Wisconsin resident and who is enrolled as an undergraduate student.</p> <p>For a UW college campus (two-year campus), cost is 1/2 of the amount that would be charged for each credit assigned to the course to an individual who is a Wisconsin resident and who is enrolled as an undergraduate student.</p> <p>For a private, nonprofit institution of higher education, cost is 1/3 of the amount that would be charged for each credit assigned to a similar course offered by the UW-Madison to an individual who is a Wisconsin resident and is enrolled at the UW-Madison as an undergraduate student.</p>	
<p>Transportation</p>	<p>Student/parent responsible for any transportation costs for attending course(s)</p> <p><i>Note: funding is available to assist in transportation costs for families in need</i></p> <p>Wis. Stat. § 118.55(7g)</p>	<p>Student/parent responsible for any transportation costs for attending course(s)</p> <p>Wis. Stat. 38.12(14)(e)</p>
